At TMS, assessments are tools that enhance the learning of students in:

- Content and subject specific skills
- 21st century skills
- Personal social emotional learning

The content and skill assessments will be a continuous process achieved through a high frequency of AFL techniques in the classroom using a wide range of digital platforms. The rubric for assessing skills provided in Annexure 3.

The end of term and end of year assessments will be the high-stake tests, conducted as per a predefined syllabus.

KINDERGARTEN – follows a continuous and comprehensive system of assessment, which is not determined by the structure of the school year. The tasks – group and individual, based on the six areas of learning, used for assessments. Classroom observations, conversations, project work and anecdotal records, aim at establishing the progress of students during the school year.

Continuous observational assessments, based on anecdotal records, photographs, rubrics and student work samples help staff to identify any children that need more support to achieve the objective and those that need challenge.

The curriculum will assess a child's growth and development under the following six areas of learning. Each area of learning assessed based on the criteria given below.

Literacy

- Communication and Language
- Language for Communication and Thinking
- Linking sounds and Letters
- Writing
- Reading

Problem Solving, Reasoning and Numeracy

- Numbers as labels and for counting
- Calculating
- Shapes, Space and Measures

Creative Development

• Being Creative, responding to experiences, expressing and communicating ideas

- Developing Imagination and Imaginative play

Knowledge and Understanding of the World




PRIMARY SCHOOL - Assessments in the Primary school are continuous and comprehensive. Students graded on classwork, homework, subject enrichment activities, collaborative work, project work, students' effort and teachers' observations. They help measure students' progress during the academic term. There are no formal examinations in Grades 1 and 2, however the 21st century skills, personal, social and emotional development and subject specific skills assessed based on a set rubric provided in Annexure 3.



All the other grades, from grade 3 to grade 10, follow the assessment structure as listed here.
